# Math Skills and the Preschool Board Game


- There is evidence that certain kinds of board games boost preschool math skills. These early skills are strongly predictive of math achievement scores later in life.
- The more board games children play better their performance in 4 areas:
- ➤ Identifying Numbers
- ➤ Counting
- ➤ Finding Numbers on a Number Line
- > When shown 2 Numbers, being able to Identify the Greater Number
- It has also been found, children who play board games in different settings, perform better in all 4 of the math
