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Title I Parental Involvement Survey

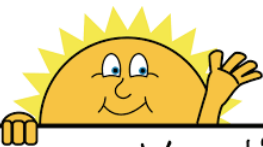

NONDISCRIMINATION NOTICE

The School District of Okeechobee County has adopted the Board Policy 6.43, Unlawful Discrimination Prohibited. Complaints may be filed with the principal or immediate supervisor, District Equity Coordinator/Director of Human Resources or the Superintendent.
